


time, imposing two semesters in a year and promotion of research activities are measures for a bright future. Mr. Rafique Rajwana congratulated the students who were conferred degrees and said that the achievement of degrees possesses immense significance in their life and they have become capable of benefitting the nation through their education. It is hoped that now they will be able to fulfill the passions of their parents and the nation. The Governor assured the Vice Chancellor of his support for the employees housing scheme, administrative matters at HED and incentives for special students. Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor said in his address that he is striving hard to upgrade the IUB as a top class university through four dimensional strategy, which includes academic excellence, financial discipline, developing infrastructure and research for national prosperity. The first priority is to prepare such manpower which may promote top class research along with high quality development and the administrative staff may get acquainted with the latest tools of administration and may run the university affairs in an exemplary way. For this purpose six selection boards were held within a few months. Action on 46,000 applications for non teaching posts is being rapidly taken for recruitment. In

this way the university is going to appoint 256 academic and 947 administrative staff by the end of this year. Training sessions for 300 employees have been held for raising their working skills. The approval of mega projects worth Rs. 850 million from the federal government is a landmark for the IUB and the VC is making efforts to get under completion mega projects completed as soon as possible. Work on two hostels and a Chemistry lab will start during next month. The building of Educational Training Department is under completion with the funds from USAID worth Rs. 270 million. For the early completion of Rahim Yar Khan Campus, request has been submitted for the additional grant of Rs. 726 million. Furthermore, a grant of Rs. 16 million is also expected very soon for ICT block. The provision of facilities to special students is being continued which include pick and drop facility and special ramps while the



request for the provision of wheel chairs and lift system has been submitted to the Governor's Secretariat. The day care center inaugurated by the Governor during his last visit is functional now while the study park will be completed in the next month. On this occasion he thanked the Honourable Chancellor and the distinguished guests for gracing the occasion.

The Department of Information, Government of the Punjab, in collaboration with the Islamia University of Bahawalpur and the All Pakistan Newspapers Society organized a seminar to launch the Honourable Prime Minister's Kissan Package in Bahawalpur Division. Engineer Muhammad Baligh ur Rehman, Minister of State for Education and Interior Affairs was the Chief Guest while Malik Muhammad Iqbal Channar, Provincial Minister for Cooperatives and Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor, were guests of honour. Engineer Muhammad Baligh ur Rehman in his address said that His Excellency Mian Muhammad Nawaz Sharif is well aware of problems of farmers and the historic kissan package introduced by him shows his commitment to the farmers. Under this package cotton and rice growers will be provided financial support of Rs. 5000 per acre, Rs. 500 subsidy on every fertilizer bag, duty free import of agriculture machinery and provision of solar tubewells on interest free loans. economy and the Honourable Chief Minister of Punjab Mian Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif is making all out efforts for the prosperity of farmers. Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor said that the Islamia University of Bahawalpur being a leading university of Southern Punjab is focusing on agricultural research. New varieties of cotton are being introduced suitable for cultivation in the local climatic conditions with better yield. International Chemistry Conference



A new building of Management Science Faculty, two hostels for 500 students each and a modern Chemistry lab will be constructed and ten faculty members would be given scholarships to get higher education abroad. Engr Mian Muhammad Baligh-ur-Rehman admired the steps taken by Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor for the imposition of IUB development and academic excellence. He said that the Government supports his efforts taken for quality education. On this occasion Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq said that during past few months solid measures have been taken to set up high quality education in all departments of IUB due to which the university will achieve better position in a very short period. The vacant seats of Senate, Syndicate and Selection Board have been filled. The delayed 46,000 applications' scrutiny, written test and interviews are going on. Similarly 1,47,000 degrees of university had been withheld and now with the kind approval of the Honourable Governor Punjab/Chancellor Rafique Rajwana the issuance of pending degrees has become possible. Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq said that he

believes in such research that may benefit the common man and the success in research of cotton is a sequence of the same. All the buildings of IUB are being made comfortable for special students. He further said that up till now, 3,044 students have benefitted from Prime Minister's Laptop Scheme and an amount of Rs. 120 million has been distributed among 7,178 students under the Prime Minister's Fee Reimbursement Scheme. Similarly 1113 students have received Rs. 132 million under the Chief Minister's PEEF Scholarship Scheme. Recently 5 students of IUB getting position in BA, BSc and BCom examination 2014 were sent to Europe by the Chief Minister Punjab and within the next few days, 45 PEEF scholars will be his guests at Punjab House Murree. This year IUB received Rs. 9.5 million enabling 137 university students to continue their higher studies. He said that administration is striving to further upgrade the facilities to encourage the potential of students. A state of the art building provided by USAID for educational training at a cost of Rs. 270 million is under construction. Working

on a mega project of Rs. 858.442 million to strengthen existing departments, introducing new academic programmes and construction of two hostels has been accelerated. Rahim Yar Khan Campus project appeared to be in jeopardy since 2007, however, the federal government has agreed to provide Rs. 726 million additional grant for completion of this project. The project of ICT block at Bahawalpur announced since 2012 is also going to be a

reality now as the Federal IT Ministry has recently released Rs. 16 million to complete this project. He felicitated those students who are availing benefits from these welfare schemes and preparing themselves for national service in their particular field.

In this regard the proportion of teachers and students, PhD, non PhD among the teachers, and officers and other staff ratios must be maintained so that the work on daily basis may continue with success. On this occasion Dr. Abdul Sattar Khan Registrar briefed on the working of his section and apprised about the issues faced by him to the Vice Chancellor. Dy. Registrars Arshad Ali Khan, Bashir Hussain, Imran Bhutta and Maj (R) Saqib Aziz presented details about performance in their branches.

IUB Budget worth Rs. 3100.596 million approved

The Islamia University of Bahawalpur approved Rs. 3150.255 million budget for the fiscal year 2015-16. The budget was approved in the Finance and Planning Committee meeting at the Abbasia Campus chaired by Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor. The committee estimated Rs.3150.255 million expenditure while Rs.2757.234 million was marked as income from various

sources. Total development budget was estimated as Rs. 675.716 million. Budget deficit will be met through good financial management, austerity measures and grants received from the federal and provincial governments.



50th Anniversary of 1965 War

Faculty and students participated in a solidarity walk organized at the Islamia University of Bahawalpur to pay tribute to martyrs of the 1965 war. The walk was part of the ongoing celebrations to mark the 50th anniversary of the 1965 war. Students also visited Yadgar-e-Shuhda at Bahawalpur Cantonment on defence day and participated in a special ceremony. University FM radio also broadcast special programmes throughout the month of September in connection with defence day celebrations. A series of seminars was held at various campuses of the university to commemorate the sacrifices and bravery of Pakistani armed forces in 1965 war. The speakers said that on the 6th of September in 1965 our country fought a historic war with arch rival India. 17-days long war enabled the Pakistanis to discover their nationhood. While on this auspicious day of September 6, we remember our valiant soldiers who sacrificed their present for nation's future, we should not forget to remember, and pay our tributes to the sons of the soil.

Past midnight on 5/6 September, without a formal

declaration of war, India Army crossed the international border and attacked Lahore and Kasur fronts. Pakistan Army and Pakistan Air Force halted the attack in its tracks, inflicting heavy casualties on the aggressor. The brave soldiers of Pakistan Army and people of Sialkot and Chawinda made Chawinda and surrounding areas the biggest graveyard of Indian tanks by saving the dear Motherland from the invading enemy. The people of Chawinda wrote a golden history of bravery by sacrificing their lives for defending the motherland near Chawinda-Badiana during the September 1965 Indo-Pak War. While we remember the 1965 war, we owe a debt of gratitude to the personalities for without them, the memories of those days will remain incomplete.

Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur during these occasions said that in higher educational institutions, there is no room for adhucism, ill planning, nepotism, and compromise on merit. Such institutions cannot be run by short term decisions and measures and neither the academic programmes can be advanced without the implementation of real merit and harmony. The development of the university relies on the inter linked and long term planning to produce cohesion with the international standards. The Higher Education Commission of Pakistan has enforced standards of international quality to implement these in the universities of the country. Among these standards the ratio of students and teachers, the difference of PhD and Non PhD teachers plus their proportion of regular employees are included in these acts. Unfortunately, this process was ignored in IUB which badly affected the entire system of the university and hindered academic progress. Backwardness, financial problems and less diagnostic and treatment facilities were the major causes of this rapidly growing disease which needed special attention of all the concerned sectors of the society for early remedy and public health. Dr. Asiya Shahid also informed the audience about the symptoms, diagnosing process and treatment of breast cancer. Around 200 students and faculty members of the University attended the seminar and were advised to promote this information as a social service.

Cotton Research Aiming at Better Quality and Yield

Cotton plays an important role in the national economy and is a major cash crop of Southern Punjab. The Islamia University of Bahawalpur has been focusing on exclusive research on cotton and introducing its new varieties in market suitable for the local climatic conditions. The Vice Chancellor exchanged these views during his visit to experimental cotton fields of the Department of Plant Breeding and Genetics, University College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. On this occasion, head of department, Dr. Muhammad Iqbal Bandesha briefed about new cotton varieties IUB-62, IUB-13, IUB-222 and IUB-QM65 which can tolerate high temperature and water deficiency. These varieties have also successfully resisted Curl Leaf Virus with better yield and fiber quality. Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor appreciated the research work on cotton beneficial for local farmers community. Meanwhile, the Punjab Seed Council has approved cotton varieties, IUB-13 and MM-58, introduced

by the College of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences, Islamia University of Bahawalpur, for general cultivation. National Biosafety Committee has also approved these varieties for commercial usage. These cotton varieties were approved because they were showing better productivity and performance under conditions of high temperature, drought and water scarcity. Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor IUB has highly encouraged the agricultural scientists from the university to grow such cotton varieties which are compatible with geographic and climatic conditions of the Southern Punjab, the cotton belt of Pakistan. A cotton variety, IUB-222, is already approved by the Punjab Government for marketing.

International Conference on Semiconductors In Finland



Prof. Dr. Muhammad Asghar Hashmi, Dean Faculty of Science, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur attended the International Conference on Defects in Semiconductors (ICDS) recently held in Finland. He presented a paper on "Growth and Characterization of 4H-SiC by Thermal Evaporation System Using Boat".

During his stay, Dr. Hashmi also met with Prof. Dr. T. Son of Linkoping University, Sweden and Prof. Dr. Oleg Soltanovich from Russia who appreciated his research work

and offered collaboration in future work. They proposed to grow P-type 4H-SiC by defusing boron into 4H-SiC layer. This will provide p-n junction of 4H-SiC to generate high efficiency blue light. This LED will solve lighting problem in villages at a cost of just four battery cells. This innovative project will be submitted to the Higher Education Commission/Pakistan Science Foundation.

HEC Research Grant for Livestock Food



Dr. Muhammad Naeem Tahir, Assistant Professor, University College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur has been awarded a Higher Education Commission's funded research project worth Rs. 3.2 million under the National Research Programme. This unique

research project will provide vital information to livestock farmers of the research area and will be completed in a period of 12 months.
