

Governor Punjab and Chancellor Chaudhry Muhammad Sarwar said that development of Southern Punjab particularly promotion of education is the top priority of the present government. Universities of Southern Punjab have important role to play in socio economic development of the region. The Governor expressed these views during a meeting with Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur at Governor's House Lahore. The budget deficit of Rs. 343 million has been converted into surplus of Rs. 171 million while development budget has also reached at the highest level in 12 years. He said that all out efforts had been made to ensure implementation of rules and regulations in the affairs of the University through a comprehensive plan to ensure institutional decision making which was lacking in the

IUB participates in 10 Billion Tree Tsunami Campaign

The Islamia University of Bahawalpur will plant 50,000 trees across the campuses under 10 Billion Tsunami Plant for Pakistan Campaign. This was stated by Prof. Dr. Qaiser Mushtaq, Vice Chancellor, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur during a ceremony to kick start tree plantation campaign at Baghda ul Jadeed Campus. He said that currently a massive tree plantation campaign is going on in the country on the direction of Honourable Prime Minister Imran Khan. The faculty and students of the Islamia University of Bahawalpur have also started an immense tree plantation campaign in the university campuses located in Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar and Rahim Yar Khan simultaneously. He advised Estate Care, Farm Management and Forestry Departments of the University to grow such fruit and timber trees which are suitable in local climatic conditions and perform better in high temperature and water scarcity. He expressed his pleasure on presence and participation of faculty and students in large number in tree plantation event. He also distributed saplings among students and planted a tree in the lawn of faculty of education. On this occasion, it was briefed that the Islamia University of Bahawalpur has grown 42,000 trees during last three years including four orchids of pomegranate, falsa, mango and jaman while 182 acres barren land has been reclaimed and converted into lawns. After the tree plantation

ceremony, faculty members and students planted saplings in faculty lawns, agriculture farms, boulevards and cricket stadium area. Meanwhile, State Bank of Pakistan donated 2000 saplings for ongoing tree plantation at IUB campuses.

mathematical enterprise maintain contact with the international mathematical community through various means, like attending conferences/seminars abroad and inviting foreign mathematicians to attend conferences in Pakistan. The primary aim of organizing such an activity is to enhance the understanding of mathematics and to provide opportunity to the working mathematicians to exchange ideas with their colleagues at the national as well as international level. The IPMC is the only forum in the country which is providing a platform on annual basis to mathematicians from Pakistan to interact and share their research contribution with eminent

mathematicians from around the world since 2000. It is pertinent to mention that Pakistan Mathematical Society awards gold medal to an eminent mathematicians every year. This year gold medal was presented to late Khawja Dil Muhammad Dil. Khawja Dil Muhammad Dil Sahib was a dedicated and dynamic individual. He was a mathematician, educationist,

administrator, political activist, poet, literary figure and a real-estate businessman. He was a prolific author. He wrote books on Algebra, Arithmetic and Geometry. His books found their niche in the curriculum of universities at Ali Garh, Bombay and Madras. He composed poetry in Urdu and his maiden collection 'Dard-e-dil' was

brought out in 1935. Dil Muhammad was born in 1883 in Lahore. With a natural flair for mathematics, he did his MA in Mathematics from Govt College Lahore in 1907. On account of his passion to serve his nation, instead of going for a government job, he preferred to join his own college, Islamia College Lahore, as a lecturer and remained there during his entire

Good planning monitoring and evaluations in ORIC context enhances the contribution of HEC by establishing clear links between past, present and future initiatives. IUB Admissions Fall 2018

As many as 3706 candidates admitted in the university out of 23460 applicants in fall semester 2018. The university offers admission twice a year according to academic calendar implemented in 2015. The academic calendar across the campuses has brought uniformity in academic activities and developed a congenial educational environment in the university. Now the semester begins and completes according to a defined academic timetable in all the faculties enabling students to pass out obtaining their degrees without any delay. The convocations are also held on the completion of the

semester on regular basis. It is important to mention that number of applicants have increased remarkably during current four years, according to details 2358 candidates obtained admission in 2015, 2974 in 2016, 6122 in 2017 and 6303 in 2018. This has resulted in remarkable boost in university ranking at national and international levels. These far-reaching academic steps have also enhanced the credibility of the university which can be observed from rise of applicants as well as merit level.

Anti Dengue Day

A seminar was held to observe anti dengue day at the Islamia University of Bahawalpur. The participants were apprised about symptoms of dengue fever and safety measures. It was briefed that dengue is an infectious disease caused by dengue virus. Dengue is transmitted to people by the bite of a female Aedes Mosquito that is infected with dengue virus. The symptoms of dengue fever include high grade fever, severe headache, severe pain behind eyes, joint pain, muscle and bone pain, rash and mild bleeding from nose or gums etc. The best way to save ourselves and our loved ones from dengue is to prevent it from spreading. The safety measures include wearing light colored cloths that cover maximum body, use of mosquito repellent lotions, coils and mosquito nets at homes. Use of wire mesh, spray of insecticides, proper disposal of garbage, covering water utensils and keeping drain holes and gutters properly covered can be helpful to prevent from dengue fever. On this

occasion informative literature was also distributed among participants. Meanwhile, the campaign of government of Punjab is being implemented by IUB as a national and academic duty, so that awareness about dengue virus may be created in students and employees. The Estate Care department ensuring the cleanliness of offices, residential colonies, teaching department, hostels and canteens on hygiene principles. 

Human Resource Development

At present from Director of IT to the Baildar (a staff of 50) all are working as one team for the Directorate of IT.

Formation of a system for every task assigned teams giving each member a specific task



within that system. Procedures for each task developed to be followed.

Modern Working Environment

To achieve efficiency and progress we needed to provide the best and the most comfortable working environment to our members of staff. Deputy Director of IT is looking after all official matters through office in Abbasia Campus now. Directorate of IT now have office and technical facility as two separate entities.

This enabled us to perform better and more, keeping in mind the needs of the members of our staff and the 24 hour operations we conduct routinely.

Infrastructure Development

The backbone of IT is a data centre which was established last year. Keeping in mind that a data centre not only provides IT services to the end user but also helps to train the man power in technology.

A building housing a data centre has a special value, it must be secure, protected and powered 24 hours a day all year around. This is an unparallel achievement as compared with any other university where they may have data centres but they cannot manage or use it without outside help.

Reforms in Accounts Department

To promote transparency and bring professionalism to all sectors, regular officers were appointed on key slots, after advertisement and necessary codal formalities, to replace the previous incumbents working on additional charges.

Following the policy of bringing the regular professionals on the key posts, university requested the services of an officer from the Civil Services of Pakistan through Higher Education Department and the Worthy Chancellor under Section 17 read with section 11 (8) of IUB, Act 1975 appointed Mr. Fakhar Bashir as Treasurer IUB through HED notification No. SO (Univ.) 4-3/2014 dated 12-11-2015.

Summary of the Reforms Introduced by the Current Incumbent

A. Reforms in funds, investments and resources of the university

- i. By incorporating proper SOP's for all kinds of expenditure and proper internal controls, the university budget was ensured to be expended on the purpose for which it is provided for. This in turn saved the university exchequer from leakage of millions of rupees through corruption and misappropriations.
- ii. Multiple reforms in the shape of SOP's, Check Lists and Office Circulars have been introduced regarding the financial aspects of all the other departments of the

University including Civil Engineering, Examinations, Transport Division, Sports Division, Estate Care and Space Management, Medical Division, Directorate of Affiliation, Private Students Affairs and Financial Aid Office to secure and safeguard the interests of the University exchequer.

- iii. The procurement process has been overhauled purely in accordance with PPRA Rules. During tenure of current incumbent, the relevant rules were implemented in letter and spirit which not only brought the value for money to the procuring agency but also contributed millions of rupees to

the university exchequer through fair and transparent procurement process.

iv. To safeguard the finances and investments of the university, the funds and accounts of the university were restructured and re-organized. The profit rates offered were consistently perused to be improved and this in turn contributed more than Rs. 100 Million per annum to the university exchequer which was being lost over the period of years.

v. The accounts of the university being maintained at the various banks have been revisited and accounted for in the daily statements. Many of the current accounts, which were serving the interests of the commercial banks, have been changed to PLS accounts which have earned an annual outlay of around Rs. 45 million.

vi. The HBL authorities have been pursued to offer a competitive rate on the regular accounts being maintained at HBL which has been revisited from 3.95% to 6.13% with an additional annual outlay of Rs. 40 million per annum.

vii. Resultantly by taking these steps by the current incumbent, university has not only ensured all of the lost and disarrayed money and investments back to channel but also an annual impact of more than Rs. 100 million has been realized by the university.

viii. The grant of the Punjab Government of Rs. 70 million was realized in the university exchequer in time by putting utmost personal effort into it.

ix. The investment of the university is being placed in line with the directions of the Syndicate along with broader guidelines of the Government of Punjab to secure the interests of university and its employees.


B. Reforms in the budgetary sector

- i. Budget document was overhauled in the light of basic principles of budgeting. Illogical and ir-rational estimates and re-appropriations were discontinued. Further it was ensured that the university budget is expended on the purpose for which it is provided in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Act, Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- ii. By incorporating proper internal control and effective financial discipline, the budget of FY 2015-16 having an initial deficit of Rs. 343 million was actually closed with the surplus of Rs. 255 million, in addition to the implementation of an emergency project of Rs. 232 million beyond the initial budget estimates of FY 2015-16.
- iii. By introducing better financial discipline, the budget deficit in Budget Estimates 2016-17 was reduced to Rs. 217 Million as compared to 343 Million of the last Financial Year and the same was actually closed with a surplus of Rs. 376 millions.
- iv. In the Budget Estimates of FY 2017-18, the deficit was further reduced to Rs. 145 million as compared to Rs. 217 million of the previous Financial Year and the same was actually closed with a surplus of Rs. 776 million.
- v. The Budget Estimates of FY 2018-19 are in surplus of Rs. 171 million as compared to Rs. 145 million deficit of the previous Financial Year due to incorporation of strong internal controls and strict financial discipline.
- vi. With the better financial management and in observance of the principle of austerity, the contingent expenditure which is mostly

enhanced up to 10% of the previous budgets was actually reduced to 2% in Financial Year 2016-17 and 5% in Financial Year 2017-18.


vii. The different heads of the budget are reformed and classified into Major, Minor and Detailed heads as per standard principles of budgeting.

C. Procurements of goods and services

The procurement process regarding procurement of goods and services has been overhauled in line of with the provisions of PPRA and rules & regulations of the Government of Punjab C&W Department respectively. During the tenure of current incumbent, the relevant rules were enforced in letter and spirit which not only brought the value for money to the procuring agency but also contributed millions of rupees to the university exchequer through fair and transparent procurement process.

D. Settlement of outstanding audit paras and steps to curtail the irregular practices

- i. Many of the audit Paras outstanding for the previous years were successfully defended and got settled at the level of Federal and Provincial PAC, SDAC and DAC.
- ii. The old irregular practices which called for audit objections were discontinued to ensure transparency and financial transactions to be made in accordance with the prevalent rules and regulations.

E. General reforms in financial and administrative sector of the department


- i. A proper system of Diary and Dispatch was introduced to ensure proper and prompt disposal of the claims related to employees, students and other relevant stakeholders to avoid the previous menace of displacement of claims.
- ii. Multiple reforms and internal controls have been incorporated to increase the revenues of the University in the first instance. Through better internal controls, the available resources are now being exploited to its maximum

limit and new vistas are being explored.

- iii. Exposure of human resource to various training session with on job skill development under the supervision of technical financial experts.
- iv. By incorporation of internal controls and financial discipline in the dispensation of the financial transactions, a minimum amount of more than Rs. 300 million per annum has been saved from being misappropriated. The steps taken by the current incumbent regarding better financial management strictly in accordance with the relevant rules, ensuring financial discipline and curtailing misappropriations are also evident from the fact that the inherited budget with a deficit of Rs. 343 million of FY 2015-16 has been transformed to a Surplus Budget of Rs. 171 million in the current Financial Year 2018-19 in less than the period of 03 years in addition to funds utilized for the record infrastructural development from university own sources.

By controlling leakage, misappropriation, corruption and corrupt practices, the saved university resources are being utilized for the infrastructural development of the university with record Developmental Budget Allocation in the last 03 years along with promotion of research facilities for researchers and university scholars. This in turn is promoting a more convenient environment for the students and faculty members to uplift the standard of education and academic excellence in the university.

By introduction of various administrative reforms, SOPs, Circulars, Check Lists, relevant training to the available human resource and effective system of check and balance through supervisory staff, the bills/claims related to employees, students and the different service providers are being facilitated for on merit and prompt clearance in minimum possible time in presence of ample amount of funds and resources on part of university exchequer to ensure provision of relevant necessary facilities both for academic and administrative staff working together for the uplift of this prestigious institution.






Motor Transport Division achieved following tasks and goals

a. Purchase of vehicles

The Islamia University of Bahawalpur is committed to provide best services to its students, faculty and staff members. Transport

department portrays the quality policy of IUB by providing comfortable and economical transport facility. The Islamia University of Bahawalpur has purchased the new vehicles for better and smooth operation of Transport Department.

b. Appointment of new Drivers

There was a shortage of drivers keeping in view of the said, following number of Drivers have been regularized and appointed.

- i) 42 Drivers regularized.
- ii) 22 Drivers newly appointed.

c. Implementation of revised averages

Implementation of revised averages is a big achievement of Motor Transport Division which was pending from last 10 years. After the implementation of these averages, Motor Transport Division is saving 275 Ltrs diesel amounting to Rs.29,700 (approx) @ Rs.108/Ltr on daily basis.

d. Income from student cards

Motor Transport Division has implemented the transport policy and stopped the traveling of outsiders and relatives of university employees traveling without payment of transport charges. Motor Transport Division has issued the student cards in Sept 2016 to the employee's children and relatives as per policy. Due to this, income of Rs.6,10,550/- (Sept 2016 - Sept 2018) has been received in university bank account.

e. Income from field trips and rental transport

Motor Transport Division has earned a handsome amount by providing the transport facility to the students for field trips and university employees for family functions on rental basis. Due to this, income of Rs.39,13,481/- (Sept 2016 - Sept 2018) has been received in university bank account.

f. Saving in lieu of improved averages

Motor Transport Division has successfully implemented the revised averages in May 2017 without any agitation and saved a huge amount in last fiscal year. Due to this implementation Rs.64,37,561/- (May 2017 - June 2018) has been saved.

g. Saving in lieu of missed rounds

Motor Transport Division has saved a reasonable amount by reducing the un-necessary routes / movement of empty buses. Motor Transport Division has strictly implemented the route checking reports for proper check and balance. Due to the missed rounds Rs.74,90,035/- (Sept 2016 - June 2018) has been saved.

h. Saving in lieu of Mobil Oil

There was a difference in issuance of Mobil Oil for heavy and light vehicles from last many years. Due to these revised SOPs Rs.1,73,505/- (Sept 2016 - June 2018) has been saved.





Achievements of Security Division

Following are the important achievements till to date:-

- a. Before taking over as Chief Security Officer, there were two other Security Officers performing duties in Security

Division. However, morale of the guards was quite low. It was a huge task to build a better image of security division in public generally and within IUB particularly. The undersigned took various corrective measures to achieve the desired standards and within a span of 3 months most of the goals were achieved. Both the officers were recommended unsuitable for further contract and finally given letter of thanks by IUB in July 2017.

- b. Corrupt practices of officers and some of their loyal guards were highlighted and strict measures taken to ensure those involved be deterred to refrain. Policies enforced produced positive results.
- c. Previously relating with civil administration were build on personal bases. However, undersigned made concrete efforts to build better image of the IUB and today the institute is enjoying very cordial relation based on mutual respect and professionalism with civil administration, police and various intelligence agencies.
- d. Students use to feel shy to contact Security Officer as they were black mailed officers. By virtue of certain positive steps taken, the students have now trust in security and feel free to contact in case of any assistance needed.
- e. Security Guards use to perform pathetic duties during day and night having no fear of any check. Polices were enforced to address the issue and today clear change is seen in the behavior / attitude and turn out of Security Guards.
- f. Previously officers use to refrain from giving punishment to the Security Guards

however, the system of stick and carrot was enforced to bring positivity in performance.

- g. 308 automatic guns were purchased previously. Due to some technical reasons and lack of coordination with DCO office licensing process was delayed. The matter was pursued and licenses received within two weeks.
- h. Bio diversity park at Derawar was taken over by IUB as a project. Iron observation posts from Baghdad ul Jadeed Campus were transported and got erected at Park. 6x Security Guards placed for duties. Security Division was the 1st to take part in the development process of the park.



- i. Rahim Yar Khan new campus was inaugurated in October/November 2017. Getting clearance from District intelligence committee was a gigantic task. Through kind guidance of Worthy Vice Chancellor/personal liaison got it done well in time. 25 Security Guards from Bahawalpur are being rotated monthly to perform security duties at Rahim Yar Khan Campus system is managed efficiently now.
- j. The undersigned being the only officer in Security Division is looking after the affairs of all five campuses of IUB and from last one year all security audits carried out by different intelligence agencies/police have been satisfactorily conducted. A positive image has been built amongst public.
- k. CCTV systems of all five campuses has been updated from last year or so and now the focal points of all campuses are covered quite effectively.


