The Award

This scholarship will facilitate award-holders with the following:

- Tuition fees for courses in eligible fields
- University hostel costs (where applicable)
- Travel to and from home to university two times a year for students staying in on-campus hostels

Subject Areas

The scholarship will cover a four-year bachelor's degree at an HEC-recognised Pakistani public university in one of the following subject areas only:

- Education
- Sustainable Energy
- Food Security and Agriculture
- Health Sciences

Eligibility Criteria

These scholarships are open to **female applicants only**.

In addition, applicants must:

- Be Pakistani nationals currently residing in Pakistan
- Be pursuing a four-year bachelor's degree in the above listed subject areas
- Hold a confirmed admission offer from an HEC recognised university in Pakistan

Young women with disabilities, from rural areas and/or minority groups are encouraged to apply.
